Digital Technology



The NZ Curriculum has recently revised the Technology area to include Digital Technologies. Minecraft is a great way to develop these skills.

Real Learning Outcomes



Can be used across a range of subjects, from history and chemistry to sustainability and languages. You can map lessons directly to specific learning outcomes and curriculum objectives. It engages students in an authentic way.

Build 21st Century Skills

Helps prepare students for the future workplace, building skills like collaboration, communication, critical thinking and systems thinking. The open learning environment gives students the freedom to experiment, encouraging creative self-expression and problem solving.
